Upon completion of this course, the Instructor Candidate should be able to:

1. Identify the effects of OC on human beings when dispersed in aerosol form
2. Define "chemical irritant" and a "chemical inflammatory" and where they are located on a use of force continuum in respect to the use of non-lethal force.
3. Demonstrate a proper stance and position of the body when holding an OC unit in the hand for use or potential use with all techniques taught in the OCAT Certification Course.
4. Deliver verbal directions or commands to combative subjects while holding an OC unit in the hand or while using OC.
5. Demonstrate how to accurately spray OC in one-second bursts or multiple one-second bursts at physically combative subjects.
6. Identify the ways to decontaminate an area that has been exposed to OC.
7. Identify the first-aid procedures available for administering to subjects that have been exposed to OC.
