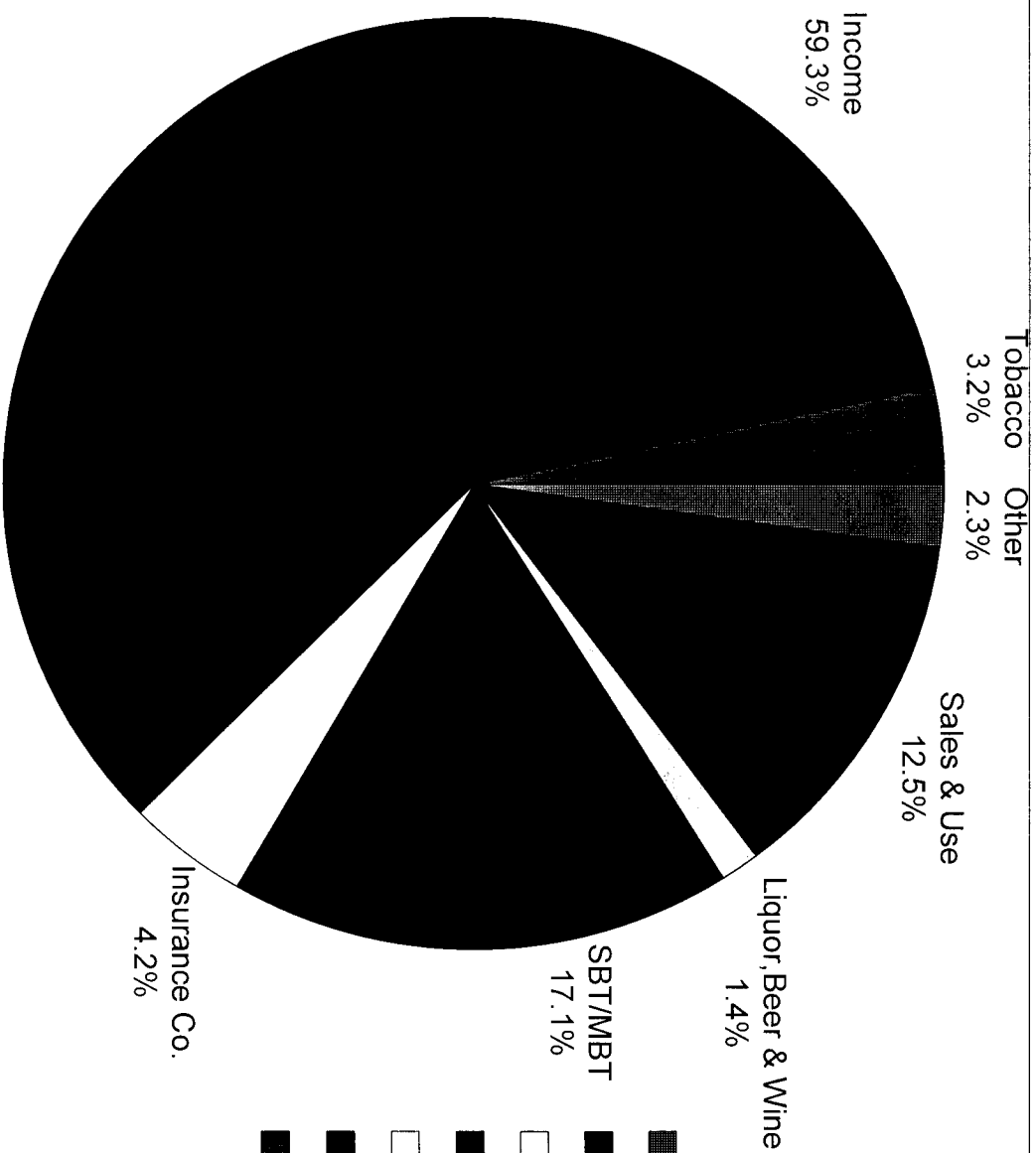

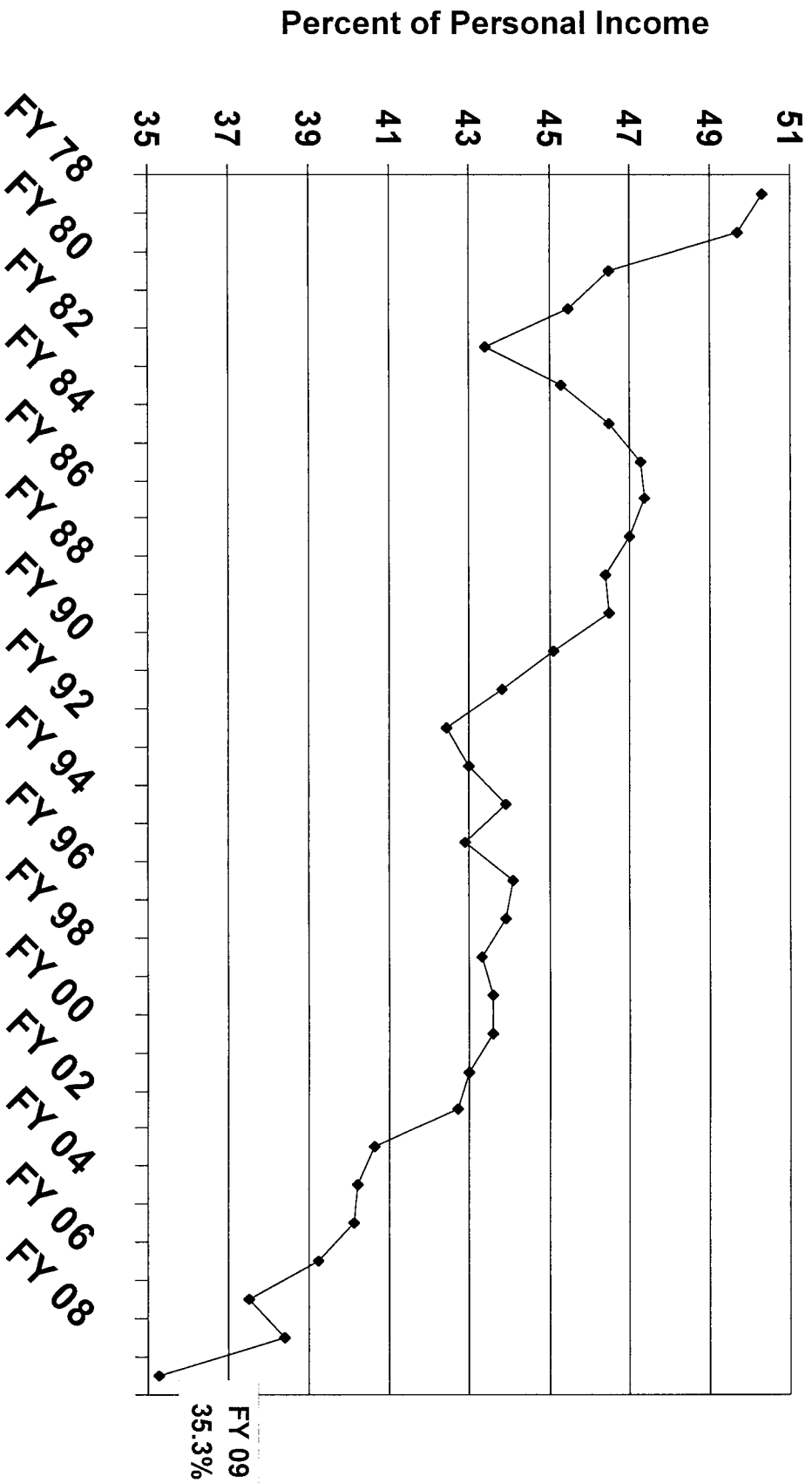
GF/GP Revenue by Tax Source--FY 09-10 (\$6.5 bil)

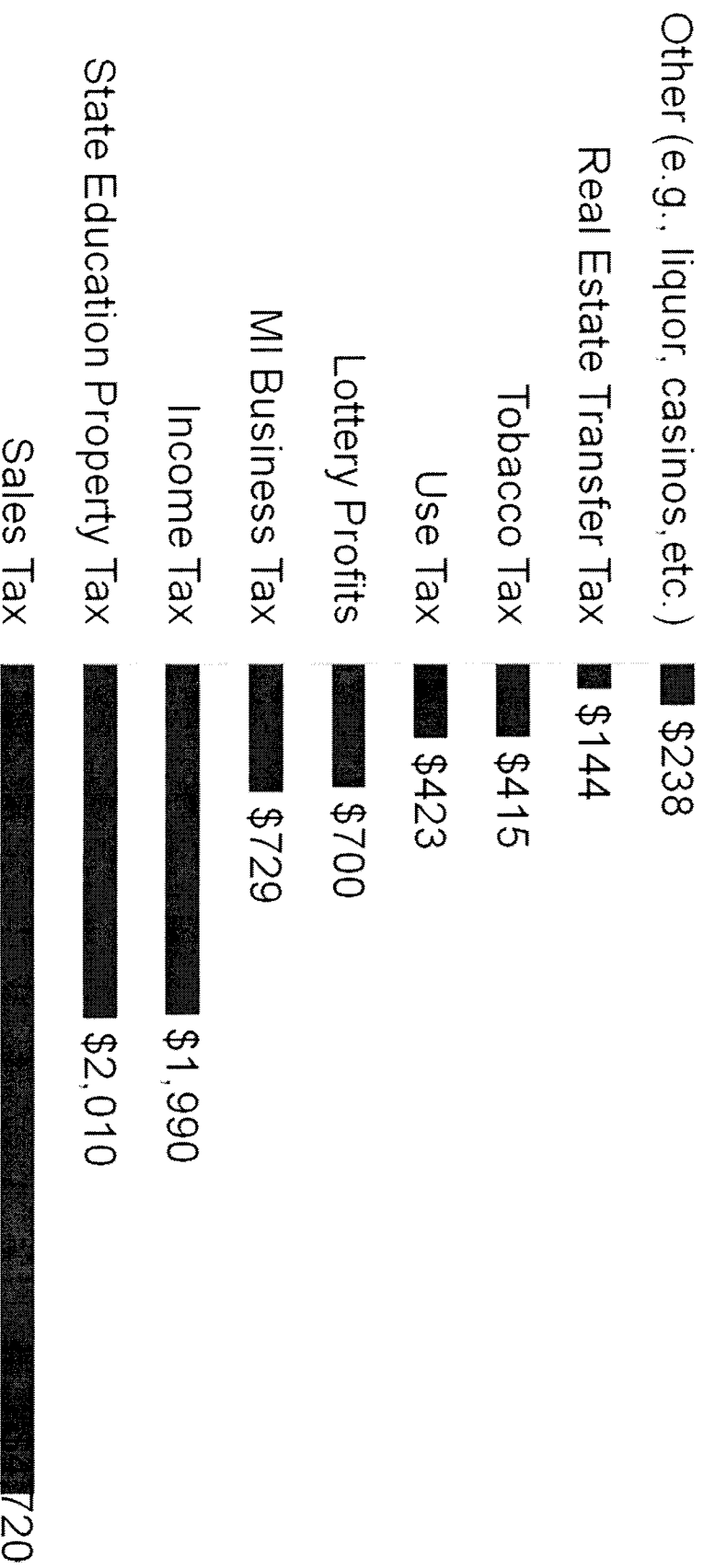
Sales Tax Share Declining

Taxable Sales as a Percent of Personal Income

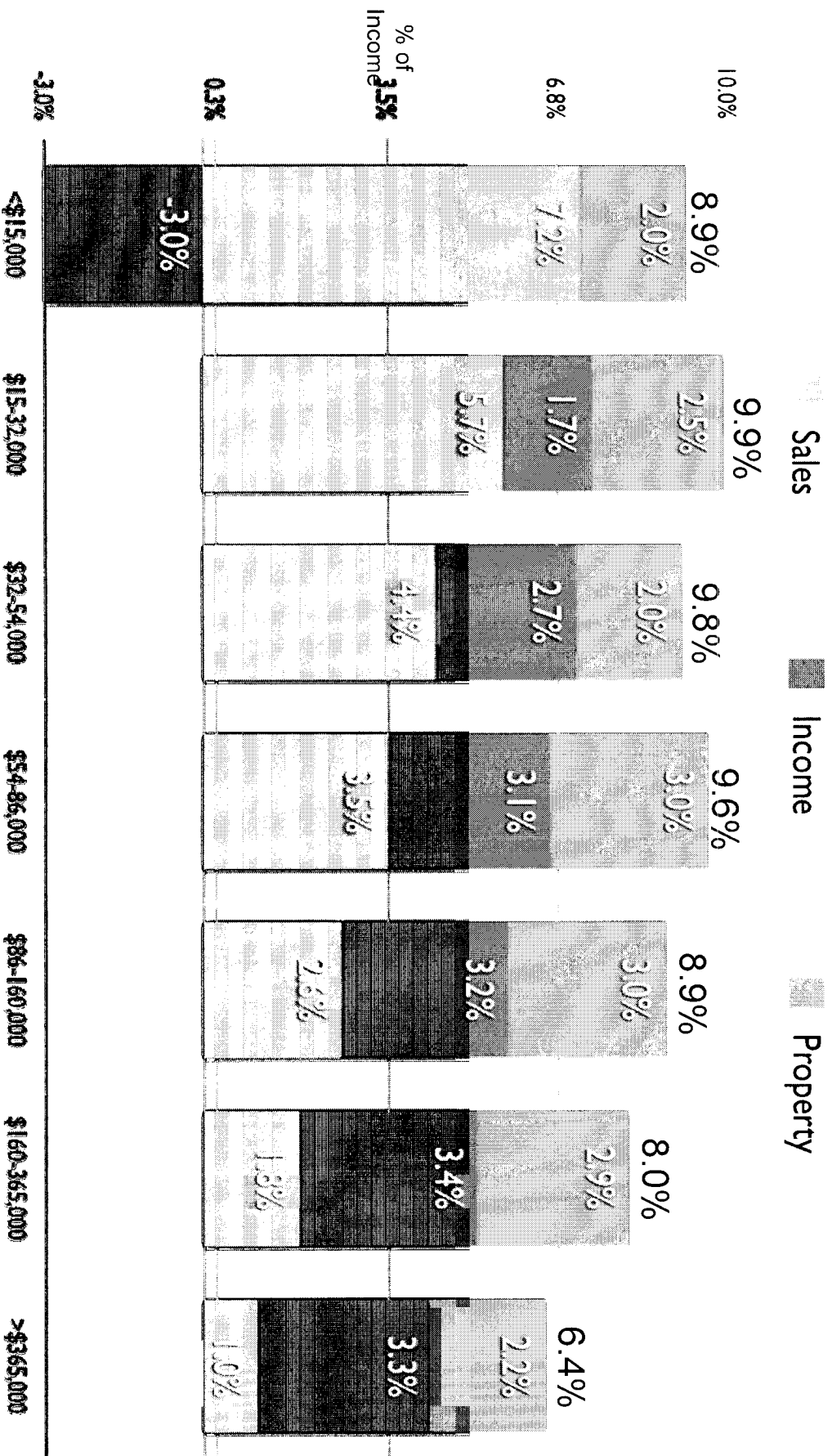


FY 2008-09 SAF Revenue
